

Effort Sharing Decision 2021-30

Strategy workshop, ECF (rue de la Science 23, Brussels), 7 Sept 2015, 09:00-13:00

The October 2014 European Council agreed that the ESD would continue to form part of the EU's climate policy, delivering -30% GHG emission reductions for the non-ETS sector by 2030 (compared to -43% for the EU ETS). The ESD is therefore a legislative file of critical importance to the EU's 2030 policy framework. At this workshop, organisations planning to work on the post-2020 ESD in 2016 are invited to discuss opportunities for policy wins on the ESD and develop a comprehensive theory of change and strategy for 2016.
